The dedication of Bismarck’s Peace Pole sculpture will be followed by messages of peace and inspiration sung by the Bel Canto Choir from Central Dakota Children’s Choir.



Bismarck’s Peace Pole was sculpted by artist Joel Selmeier and sponsored by the Bismarck Parks & Recreation District, Gandhi Peace Network of North Dakota, and Dakota West Arts Council.



The Peace Pole is an internationally-recognized symbol of the hopes and dreams of the entire human family, standing vigil in silent prayer for peace on earth. More than 100,000 of these monuments have been placed around the world in over 180 countries, including North Magnetic Pole, the Hiroshima Peace Memorial, the World Trade Center in New York following the 9/11 attacks, the site of the Egyptian Pyramids in Giza, and the Aiki Shrine in Iwama, Japan. Each peace pole displays the message “May Peace Prevail on Earth” in the language of the country where it has been placed, along with other translations.
