RE:

Public Hearing - 2026 Budget

The enclosed 2026 budget as introduced at the July 17, 2025, board meeting has a total budget of \$28,217,650 for all funds. The total general fund budget is \$22,396,900. Total mills are estimated to be 32.31 mills for the 2026 budget – a decrease of .37 mills compared to the previous year.

The budget includes a 3% merit increase for all full-time employees. The seasonal pay plan is adjusted to remain competitive with the job market. The budget includes one new full-time employee for the Park District for 2026.

The Park District's 2026 budget was posted on the www.bisparks.org web site. One email regarding the District's 2026 budget was received since the budget was introduced in July.

The public hearing on the budget is scheduled to occur during the September 11 Park Board meeting that begins at 5:15 p.m. Upon conclusion of the public hearing and consideration of any final adjustments, staff recommends approval of the second reading of the budget resolution and mill levy. After approval of the budget resolution and the mill levy, staff recommends adoption of the 2026 budget.



Preliminary Statement

The purpose of the neighborhood parks and Greenway policy is to maintain and enhance the high-quality visual aesthetic of the community and to ensure that adequate usable neighborhood parks, Greenway and recreational facilities are provided for the existing and future residents of the City of Bismarck. Because new development within the City, or intended to be in the City, increases population and the demand for public services, it shall be the policy of the City of Bismarck that the owner and/or Landowner of major urban residential subdivision plats provide for neighborhood parks, playgrounds, Greenway and natural areas, and trails. The provision of such facilities in newly developed areas maintains the high quality of the life enjoyed by the citizens of the community by permitting the City to identify, obtain, continue, maintain and enhance its recreation and Greenway system.

Landowner is the owner of a 2.5 acre, more or less, tract of real property (Park Area) and an 8.1 acre, more or less, tract of real property (Greenway Area) located in, or planned to be annexed to, the City of Bismarck, Burleigh County, North Dakota (the "Landowner Property"), specifically described below and delineated on the plat/survey as attached Exhibit A:

Greenway Area/Trail Easement - Lot 20, Block 1 (8.1 acres) and Park Area - Lot 1, Block 6 (2.5 acres) in William Blackstone Addition

Landowner is in the process of planning a residential development on the Landowner Property in which the Landowner desires to include a neighborhood park of approximately 2.5 acres and a greenway of approximately 8.1 acres on the Landowner Property, the location being generally shown on Exhibit A. Landowner/Assign's focus is to create a community with its own character and to provide residential development and recreational amenities for the support of the community and to promote ease of access in and around the community.

Park District desires to establish an additional neighborhood park in Bismarck and will design the 2.5-acre tract (the "Park Area") and a trail in the 8.1-acre tract (the "Greenway Area"). The Park District will affect the construction of the park amenities and manage the Park Area and the trail in the Greenway Area, all pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the rules and regulations established by the Board of Park Commissioners from time to time.

The Park Area and Greenway Area will play a vital role in this development by not only providing recreational amenities for this community and the surrounding area but also to provide the necessary connections throughout the development to other areas in Bismarck. To the extent appropriate and possible, all trails will ultimately connect to current and future Park District parks.

Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above preliminary statements, the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and for other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Scope of Agreement.</u> This Agreement shall not constitute a partnership or a joint venture by and between the Landowner and the Park District. Neither party has a right or obligation to bind the other party to any course of action or commitment as it relates to the development of the Landowner Property, including the Park Area that is described herein. Each of the parties is an independent contractor and, although they will coordinate their efforts to develop the Park Area, possibly to include elements of design, access and amenities, neither party is assuming any obligation of the other party.
- 2. <u>Conveyances.</u> On the date of closing, as herein described, Landowner shall cause to be transferred and conveyed to the Park District the approximately 2.5 +/- acres that constitutes this portion of the Park Area, as is in the general location as shown on the site plan attached as Exhibit A and further delineated on Exhibit A-1. The terms of the conveyance are described in the attached Exhibit C, Real Estate Purchase Contribution Agreement. The parties acknowledge that the approved plat shall dedicate the Park Area to public use and include a trail easement in the Greenway.

Landowner will provide the Park District with an abstract of title to the Park Area no later than ten (10) days prior to closing. In lieu of an abstract of title, the Landowner at its option may provide to the Park District an owner's policy of title insurance in an amount equal to the sales price of the Park Area as stated in the Real Estate Purchase Agreement or attorney opinion of title.

- 3. <u>Landowner and Park District Obligations.</u> Landowner and Park District acknowledge that they will be responsible for the following amenities to be located on the Landowner Property and the Park Area and Greenway Area:
 - a. Specific Neighborhood Park Amenities are described on Exhibit B and will be installed by the Park District and financed through a City of Bismarck special assessment improvement district with the costs for the Specific Park Amenities assessed against the benefitted Lot Owners property as described in Exhibit A-2.
 - b. Park District District-wide Amenities are described on Exhibit B and will be installed by the Park District and financed through a City of Bismarck special assessment improvement district with the costs for the Park District District-wide Amenities assessed against the benefitted Park District Property. The Landowner, at its sole cost and expense, will cause to be performed the rough grading and stormwater crossing for the trail in the Greenway.
 - c. The Landowner shall provide the necessary easements for utilities for the Park Area.
 - d. The Landowner, at its sole cost and expense, shall provide the following with regard to the Park Area:
 - i. The Landowner will provide an easement for the trail and all engineering and infrastructure required for the trail crossing, including the culvert.
 - ii. Prepare a complete boundary survey of the Park Area showing all rights-of-way, easements and any other physical burdens that may encumber the Park Area. The Landowner shall cause the Park Area to be staked so that it can be later identified by the Park District.
 - iii. The Landowner will provide the Park District with copies of such tests, investigations and reports which may have been completed by the Landowner including, but not limited to, any soil boring tests and results of environmental testing. Should such test disclose that the Park Area cannot support the intended park development or if there are environmentally hazardous conditions on the Landowner Property and/or Park Area, the Park District will

not be required to close and accept the portion of the Landowner Property to be included in the Park Area.

- iv. To the best of its ability, the Landowner shall provide the Park District with safe access to the Park Area and such areas leading to the Park Area.
- 4. <u>Park Area Design.</u> The Park District shall develop a design for the Park Area that provides park activities, such as walking trails, shelters and playgrounds. Attached on Exhibit A-1 is the parties' initial concept of the park design. As the Park District designs and plans the Park Amenities for the Park Area, it will provide the Landowner with periodic reports.
- 5. <u>Maintenance.</u> In entering into this Agreement, the Park District contemplates it will maintain the Park Area within its normal park maintenance program and consistent with other parks within the Bismarck area. The Park District will be generally responsible for future maintenance of the Park Area, the trails leading to the Park Area and the equipment and the other Park Amenities in the Park Area. If the Landowner and the Park District agree to coordinate access to other trails or parks or provide other amenities, any such other amenities agreed to by and between the Park District and the Landowner may require a joint maintenance agreement.
- 6. <u>Construction.</u> The construction of the Park Amenities described in Section 3 and as shown on Exhibit B are intended to be completed after the infrastructure of the surrounding development is complete and are dependent on the approval of a City of Bismarck special assessment improvement district.
 - 7. Naming Rights. The Landowner requests to name the Park Area, VandeWalle Park.
 - 8. General Provisions.
 - a. This Agreement, together with the other surveys, plans and specifications that have been reviewed by the parties or will later be provided pursuant to this Agreement and the attachments hereto, contain the entire agreement among the parties respecting the matters herein set forth and supersede all prior discussions with respect to such matters. Notwithstanding the above, the parties acknowledge that this is a work in progress and development of the final design for the Park Area will be part of this Agreement.
 - b. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of all the parties and their respective successors and assigns.
 - c. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of North Dakota.
 - d. This Agreement may be modified only by a written document signed by all parties. A purported oral modification shall not be effective.
 - e. The Landowner shall hold the Park District harmless for any claim or injury to a person or property arising out of, or in the course of, its construction, design, and plan of the Park Area. In like manner, the Park District, once it acquires the Park Area and assumes maintenance responsibility, will hold the Landowner harmless for claims arising out of its negligence in maintaining the Park Area.

REAL ESTATE PURCHASE CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT

THIS REAL ESTATE CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT is entered into as of the 11th day of September, 2025, by and between Lucinda Ward, whose address is 191 Prairie Court, Fond Du Lac, WI 54938, Michael Ward, whose post office address is 201 South Main Street, Suite 200, Minot, ND 58701, Adrian L. Ward, whose address is 616 North 7th Street, Bismarck, ND 58501, Nichole Phillips, whose address is 6351 River Road, Bismarck, ND 58501, Elizabeth Martin, whose address is 8 10th Avenue NE, Minot, ND 58703, Arthur Ward, whose address is 2600 24th Street SE, Minot, ND 58701 (as "Contributors"), and the PARK DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BISMARCK, a park district under the laws of the State of North Dakota, 400 East Front Avenue, Bismarck, North Dakota 58504 (as "Recipient").

In consideration of the mutual terms, covenants, conditions and agreements herein contained, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- 1. <u>Contribution of Real Property</u>. Contributor agrees to contribute, convey, assign, transfer and deliver to Recipient, and Recipient agrees to accept, acquire and take from Contributor, all of Contributor's right, title and interest, in and to that certain real property located at Lot 1, Block 6 of William Blackstone Addition, in the City of Bismarck, in the County of Burleigh, State of North Dakota.
- 2. **Purchase Price, Payment and Contribution**. The agreed value of the real property is four hundred thirty-five thousand, six hundred dollars (\$435,600). The agreed price to be paid by the Buyer to Seller for the real property shall be four hundred thirty-five thousand, six hundred dollars (\$435,600) which shall be paid by wire transfer upon the date of closing.
- Special Assessment District for this Property is created by the City of Bismarck. Contributor shall deliver at the time of closing a Warranty Deed conveying title to the Recipient free and clear of all liens and encumbrances and subject to easements, zoning and restrictions of record. Real estate taxes and special assessments shall be prorated to the time of Closing with the Recipient responsible for all taxes accrued after the Date of Closing. The Contributor is responsible for all taxes accrued before the date of closing. Contributor will provide the Recipient with an abstract of title to the real property no later than ten (10) days prior to closing. In lieu of an abstract of title, the Contributor at its option may provide to the Recipient an owner's policy of title insurance or attorney's title opinion in an amount equal to the sales price.
- 4. <u>Possession of the Property</u>. Recipient shall be given possession of the property on the date of closing.
- 5. **Risk of Loss**. The risk of loss by destruction or damage to the property by fire or otherwise prior to the closing of the sale is that of the Contributor.

- 6. <u>Survival</u>. All of the terms, covenants, conditions, representations, warranties and agreements of this Real Estate Contribution Agreement shall survive and continue in force and effect and shall be enforceable after the Date of Closing and delivery of the Warranty Deed.
- 7. <u>Effective Real Estate Contribution Agreement</u>. This Real Estate Contribution Agreement shall become effective and shall be binding upon the parties only after it has been executed by all of the parties.
- 8. Entire Agreement: Modification. This Real Estate Contribution Agreement constitutes the entire and complete agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior oral or written agreements between the parties with respect to the Property. It is expressly agreed that there are no verbal understandings or agreements which in any way change the terms, covenants and conditions set forth herein, and that no modification of this Real Estate Contribution Agreement and no wavier of any of its terms and conditions shall be effective unless in writing and duly executed by the parties.
- 9. <u>Binding Effect</u>. All covenants, agreements, warranties and provisions of this Real Estate Contribution Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, representatives, successors and assigns. When used herein, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the use of one gender shall include all other genders, as and when the context so requires.
- 10. <u>Controlling Law</u>. This Real Estate Contribution Agreement has been made and entered into under the laws of the state of North Dakota, and said laws shall control its interpretation.
- 11. **Time of Essence**. Time is of the essence as to all dates and time periods set forth in this Agreement.
